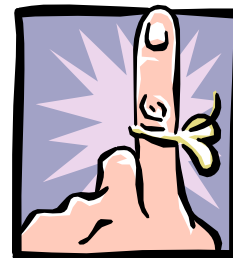
Club #1270 Humorous and Table Topics Speech Contests

How does a club contest work? It's really like a regular meeting.

Table Topics – All contestants will leave the room so not to hear the
responses of the others. Contestants will be brought in one at a time
to speak. The first contestant will draw a topic for all the contestants
to speak on.

Humorous Contest – Contestants will present a humorous speech,
5-7 minutes in length. It must be an original speech, but can be one
that you have previously presented.

The order of speakers will be chosen randomly.

Everyone in the audience will use a judge's ballot and rate each of
the contestants. The ballots will be collected and tallied to determine
1st place and runner-up. First place speakers will advance to the
Area contest to be held in October at the Portage Public Library. We
can all give evaluations of the speakers to better prepare them for
the area contest.

Humorous and Table Topics Speech Contests

The Club contests will take place during our September 24th meeting.

The **Humorous Speech Contest** is a lot of fun, one of the main purposes of this contest is to recognize the value of humor in speaking, which as you know is a very powerful way of getting a point across. The speech should be five-to-seven minutes; the subject is to be chosen by the contestant, as long as you are careful not to use potentially objectionable material, anecdotes and language. The speech must also be thematic in nature (opening, body and close), not a monologue (series of one-liners).

The **Table Topics Contest** is very similar to the way we do Table Topics at the Club meetings, except that there is a single question, and Contestants don't hear the question until it is their turn. This is to keep things fair. I have personally participated in this contest, and it is a lot of fun. You know the thrill of the contest, the excitement and nervousness of waiting your turn, and the anticipation building up before they announce the winners, very exciting. I actually won my Club contest and made it to the Division Contest (Club-Area-Division). This gave me the opportunity of knowing more about Toastmasters, other Toastmaster members and the different levels of the organization. The important thing to win this contest is to have your technique down, that way no matter what the questions is, you can find your way around.

I want to encourage everybody to participate, this will give you the chance to get a little outside of your comfort zone (or a lot if you win), and bring out the competitive beast in you.

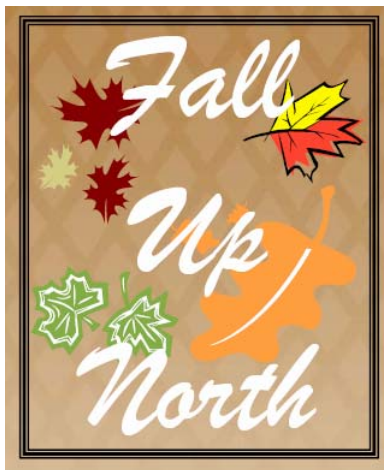

WHAT YOU MISSED AT OUR LAST MEETING on Sept 10th!

Alex, our President introduced our Toastmaster, **Jim**, at 6:05 pm, who ran a good meeting ending on time. **Renee** served ably as timer for the first time, after being started by **Alison**. We had 10 members and three guests: **Stacy** Burdette, **Ellen** Rhinestone, and **Girish** (explained his other name was too long).

Tip-of-the-Day: **James** gave our Tip-of-the-Day, explaining marketing principles – that we all want time, money, looks, health, youth, easy life, and peace of mind, and how we would be well to consider our speeches needed to address these desires (weaknesses).

Table Topics: **James** set up a very interesting Table Topics by announcing three events, a Murder, A Kidnapping, and a Plane Crash. Volunteers took the podium as the “Chief of Police” or other spokes persons, holding a “*news conference*” about the event. Members of the audience were given starter questions to ask, and others had no trouble coming up with yet more probing questions.

- **Tom** started by explaining a little girl had been missing for 5 hours and the audience soon tried to pin him down to a suspect, but the mother had 5 prior husbands and all were perhaps ‘persons of interest’. It went on from there.
- **Tracy** explained that her office was requesting no more calls about a UFO that might have caused the plane crash – when pressed about the crash site, she admitted that no plane had been found, only a hole in the ground.
- **Alex** explained the carnage at a shoot out, apparently. When asked if the murder weapon had been found, he explained with excitement, “Oh, we have *plenty* of weapons”, which brought the house down
- **Matt** and **Aaron** had equally creative press conferences. (**Tom** missed taking notes on them)

All agreed it was a fantastic idea for table topics, and **James** will probably return with it again.

Speeches: **Alex** gave an inspiring speech on our coming Speech Contest. **Tom** evaluated his talk. **Tracy** gave a polished speech for which she has become known. **Aaron** evaluated **Tracy**.

Business Meeting: **Alex** recognized our three new CC achievements with official Toastmaster badges to **Ron**, **James**, and **Tom**. In planning for our speech contest, **Tracy** agreed to consider entering the humorous speech contest, while **Alex** collected several volunteers for the Table Topics contest, and made a plea for judges and other roles. Our September 24th meeting will be a speech contest format. **Matt** explained that all are to get him Toastmaster dues by October, so the next meeting would be good.

Reports: **Ron**, as our Grammarian, was impressed that we did not have many ums and ahs. **James** was our General Evaluator and was very impressed with us, explaining both the fun and growth we had during the meeting.

ROLE DESCRIPTIONS

TOASTMASTER: Leads the weekly meeting, introducing the speakers and requesting reports.

TIP OF THE DAY: Got a great idea or tip for better speaking or leadership skills? Share it with the club.

TABLE TOPICS: Selects a topic and leads the Table Topics portion of the meeting.

TIMER: Times all speakers and gives reports at the end of the various portions of the meetings.

GRAMMARIAN: Listens for "uh's", "um's," "you know's," "so's", other distracting verbiage as well as bad grammar, good use of language and gives a report at the end of the meeting.

GENERAL EVALUATOR: Conducts the Evaluation portion of the meeting and gives a general evaluation of the meeting at the end of the meeting.

SPEAKER: Present to the club your next Competent Communicator or Advanced Communicator speech.

EVALUATOR: Evaluators give a selected speaker an oral evaluation of their speech and will also give the speaker a written evaluation using the guide in the manual.

COMPETENT LEADERSHIP PROGRAM: Be sure to use your role for credit in the Competent Leadership program. For further information on the role and responsibilities refer to the descriptions in the back of your communications manual or talk to one of our club officers.
